Describe a challenge you have faced as an educational therapist:

In my role as the case manager, I had a client where the parents, step-parents, and school were always at odds. It was a weekly struggle to remain professional when it was clear the adults had their own agendas and did not have the client's best interests at heart. I often felt like a referee.

Describe a highlight of your educational therapy career:

Here's a very recent highlight. I worked with a child from 5th through the beginning of 9th grade. Our focus was on EF Skills, spelling and writing. He blossomed and I "set him free" after he settled into high school. Two months ago, he called and asked me if I would help him hone his college essays. He said, "You know me and I would really value your input."

What do you think the future of the educational therapy profession will look like?

Bright and exciting! We're learning more about how to provide ET virtually, to utilize AI as a tool in our practices, and to navigate the world post-pandemic. These keep my intellectual curiosity buzzing!
